

WATeR's Trail Builders Restore Damage to Halls Bend (Boy Scout) Trail

Working outside their usual area, WATeR's East Lakeshore Trailbuilders heard about the problems on the Halls Bend Trail and asked TVA if they could help. A dozen trail builders and folks from TVA spent two mornings in May to re-route the trail back from the shoreline where several cave-ins had occurred.

This is just another example of the year round work WATeR provides to all residents and visitors to our watershed. WATeR organizes the shoreline annual cleanup (more than 13 tons by 350 volunteers this year – 150+ tons of trash in 18 years), provides continuous monitoring of water quality, and has built and maintains more than 30 miles of hiking trails – making WATeR one of the most valuable resources to every resident of Loudon County.

Residents are encouraged to volunteer for WATeR's many activities – the annual watershed cleanup, trails maintenance, water quality and administrative tasks in membership and marketing always need fresh faces.
